'Improving the Health of the Poorest Fastest'

Prof Aidan Halligan was appointed by Public Health England to lead on this initiative. The former Deputy Chief Medical Officer for England is Chair of the Faculty for Homeless and Inclusion Health based at the College of Medicine, Guy's Hospital, and is Chairman of Pathway which is establishing a blueprint for developing health services for the homeless within the NHS.

He argues that the way we treat the most damaged and vulnerable people reflects our priorities as a society. Prevention is the only long-term response.
